

NEED+ Gerund/Infinitive

→ Normally when we speak, we start with our subject- The person who will **do** the action

Ex: I **need to wash** my car.

However, the verb **NEED** can be used a little differently. We can focus on the object instead of the subject.

My car **needs** _____.

Need+ _____ing

My car needs **washing**.

The kitchen needs **cleaning**.

Need+ to be _p.p._

My car needs **to be washed**.

The kitchen needs **to be cleaned**.

These sentences are technically **passive voice** because we focus on the object.
