# COMPARATIVES & SUPERLATIVES

Adjectives	Rule	Comp.	Superl.	Examples.
<b>1 syllable</b>	-ER / -EST	-ER	-EST	Faster/ Fastest.
<b>Ends -e</b>	-R/ -ST	-R	-ST	Nicer/Nicest
<b>Ends -y</b>	Y -> 'i'	-IER	-IEST	Pretty-prettier
<b>Short: vowel + consonant</b>	Double the last consonant	-ER	-EST	Big-bigger/ Hot-hottest.
<b>+2 Syllables.</b>	MORE/MOST + Adj.	MORE	MOST	More intelligent
<b>Irregular</b>	Good Bad Far Little	Better Worse Further Less	Best Worst Furthest Least	

# COMPARATIVES & SUPERLATIVES



How to write:

1.EQUAL COMPARATIVES= **As...as**: She is **as** nice **as** my sister.

2.COMPARATIVES= Comparative adjective + **than** + complements : She is nicer than my sister.

3.SUPERLATIVES= **The** + Superlative adjective + complements: She is The nicest girl I know.

COMPARISON OF ADJECTIVES			
Positive	Comparative		Superlative
 big	 bigger	 biggest	(Note: Put THE before a superlative)
One syllable	clear	-er clearer	-est clearest
	dark	-er darker	-est darkest
One syllable ending with -e	wise	-r wiser	-st wisest
	simple	-er simpler	-est simplest
Adjectives ending with one vowel and one consonant	thin	-er thinner	-est thinnest
	fat	-er fatter	-est fattest
Two syllables ending in -y	busy	-er busier	-est busiest
	merry	-er merrier	-est merriest
Three or more syllables	creative	more + more creative	most + most creative
	popular	more + more popular	most + most popular
Irregular Adjectives	good	better	best
	bad	worse	worst
	little	less	least
	much	more	most
