COMPARATIVES & SUPERLATIVES

Adjectives	Rule	Comp.	Superl.	Examples.
1 syllable	-ER / -EST	-ER	-EST	Faster/ Fastest.
Ends -e	-R/ -ST	-R	-ST	Nicer/Nicest
Ends -y	Y -> 'i'	-IER	-IEST	Pretty-prettier
Short: vowel + consonant	Double the last consonant	-ER	-EST	Big-bigger/ Hot-hottest.
+2 Syllables.	MORE/MOST + Adj.	MORE	MOST	More intelligent
Irregular	Good Bad Far Little	Better Worse Further Less	Best Worst Furthest Least	

COMPARATIVES & SUPERLATIVES



How to write:

1. EQUAL COMPARATIVES = **As...as**: She is **as nice as** my sister.

2. COMPARATIVES = Comparative adjective + **than** + complements : She is **nicer than** my sister.

3. SUPERLATIVES = **The** + Superlative adjective + complements: She is **The nicest girl I know.**

COMPARATIVES & SUPERLATIVES

COMPARISON OF ADJECTIVES

Positive	Comparative	Superlative
 big	 bigger	 biggest <small>(Note: Put THE before a superlative)</small>
One syllable	clear dark	-er -est clearer darker
One syllable ending with -e	wise simple	-r -st wiser simpler
Adjectives ending with one vowel and one consonant	thin fat	-er -est thinner fatter
Two syllables ending in -y	busy merry	-er -est busier merrier
Three or more syllables	creative popular	more + most + more creative more popular
Irregular Adjectives	good bad little much	better worse less more best worst least most
