

# Simple Present vs Present Progressive

## Simple Present

- ❖ It is used to express habitual actions, routines
- ❖ **Signal words:** always, never, often, sometimes, usually, regularly, every day, once a month, ...

## Present Progressive

- ❖ It is used for actions that are happening now, at the time of speaking
- ❖ **Signal words:** now, at the moment, just, right now, at present, today, ...
