## PERFECT MODALS 1 (MODAL + HAVE + V3/ed)

Notes: What is a "perfect modal"?

- Perfect modals are not actually "perfect," but they are called that because they use a modal verb (in this
  case, could, should, might/may, must) followed by a perfect tense construction ("have" + past
  participle).
- Perfect modals are used to talk about past actions.

Must have + past participle

Express a deduction about something that has happened. We feel quite sure about it.

I didn't hear her voice . She must have gone out.

Can't have + past participle

Express a deduction about something that didn't happen in the past based on present evidence.

She can't have passed such a difficult exam.

Should have + past participle

Express the idea that something was desirable or needed but didn't take place.

She should have asked you before borrowing your pen.

Shouldn't have + past participle

Something took place but it wasn't desirable.

She shouldn't have taken the matter too seriously.
