

## Pressurized irrigation systems

### Form

	Adjective	Comparative	Superlative
<b>Regular</b> (1 syllable)	big fast	bigger faster	the biggest the fastest
(2 syllables ending in -y)	busy friendly	busier friendlier	the busiest the friendliest
(2 or more syllables)	modern difficult important	more modern more difficult more important	the most modern the most difficult the most important
<b>Irregular</b>	good bad far	better worse further / farther	the best the worst the furthest / farthest

For one-syllable adjectives with one short vowel and ending in one consonant, we double the consonant.

hot      hotter      the hottest      big      bigger      the biggest

### Use

We use the comparative to compare two things.

*Example* The Bristol Hotel is cheaper than the Hilton.

We use the superlative to compare one thing to two or more things.

*Example* Russia is the largest country in the world.
