When Datin Seri Tiara Jacqueline was given the movie script for 'Puteri Gunung Ledang', she sat on it for six years! She was excited by the story of the love triangle between Hang Tuah, Sultan Mahmud and the mysterious princess who lived atop Gunung Ledang in Johor; and she thought it could be made into a good movie. Yet, she was unsure about doing the role.

Finally, she decided to take on the challenge. The movie was on, however, to portray Puteri Gunung Ledang properly, Tiara decided, she had to go and experience the life of a real Javanese Princess.

Tiara met up with Puteri Astrini, sister of the Sultan of Solo, who arranged for her stay at the Mangkunagaran royal palace in Solo, Java. She visited Mangkunagaran palace twice and stayed nearly a month each time.

"I wanted to experience and see what the life was really like and to learn all I could about Javanese royal culture. I wanted to learn the dances, music, social graces and manners of the Javanese royalty. In Mangkunagaran palace, I learned how to play the 'rebab', sing classical Javanese prose and perform court dances," she said.

Known for their spirituality and mysticism, the ancient Javanese were masters of 'jamu' (herbal medicine) and meditation. Tiara was placed alone in an empty room to meditate for hours. "The room had thick walls and was completely quiet. You could almost hear your heart beating. I practiced meditation and fasting."

To her amazement, Tiara learned that the life of a Javanese princess was a hard one! "I had to sleep on the hard cement floor and was woken up four times a night to meditate. Now I admire Javanese princesses. They can endure hardship despite their delicate looks. When you are deprived of food, even simple things taste good! I was only given white rice and water but after prolonged fasting, they certainly tasted delicious. As a treat, I would be given a piece of fried chicken. And yes, I lost weight!"

She was put through a military drill. "Wars from the time of Sri Vijaya and Majapahit empires meant a kingdom could be overthrown overnight and royal children must learn to survive or they will die. This is why even princesses must be strong."

Among other things, she was also taught humility. "At first, it seemed strange that a princess has to act in a humble way as royalty is highly respected in Solo. Then I learned that the royals are respected because they deserve it. They think before they speak, and don't just say anything they wish!" she said.

However, Tiara's stay in Solo ended on a sad note. "Ibu Dinar, who taught me and all the princesses the art of grooming, died before the film was released. She promised to come to Kuala Lumpur on opening night but this was unfulfilled. She was the most elegant and beautifully groomed lady I have ever met! I miss her and hope I lived up to her expectations in the movie."

The movie "Puteri Gunung Ledang" premiered in 2004 and went on to win 11 awards at the recent Asia Pacific Film Festival, where Tiara Jacquelina picked up the best actress award for her role in the film. Then, about 30,000 saw the musical when it was staged at Istana Budaya, in 2006. Local and international audiences were captivated with grace and charm that Tiara projected as the mysterious princess on the high mountain, but few knew the lengths that Datin Tiara went to learn the role.
