

SPELLING PRACTICE

Some words remain the same in singular and plural form, as in *species*, for most words ending in *f* or *fe* change the *f* and *fe* to *v* and add *es* to form the plural form as in *thieves* or *knives*. For some exceptions, from the plural *y* adding *s* as in *beliefs* or *tariffs*. For most words ending in *o*, add *s* to form the plural, as in *tuxedos*. Some exceptions add *es* as in *mosquitoes* or *dominoes*
