**MY FAVOURITE LOCAL CUISINE**

Talk to any Malaysian who is abroad, and one thing they will say that they miss about Malaysia is its food. Do you agree with me? So which local cuisine that you love the most? My favourite is *Nasi Lemak*. Due to its popularity among Malaysians, it could be considered as the national dish in Malaysia. It is also one of the most famous dishes for a Malay-style breakfast.

*Nasi Lemak* was mentioned in a book "The Circumstances of Malay Life", written by Sir Richard Olof Winstedt in 1909. With roots in Malay culture and Malay cuisine, its name in Malay literally means "oily or fatty rice", but is taken in this context to mean "rich" or "creamy". The name is derived from the cooking process whereby rice is soaked in coconut cream and then the mixture steamed. The rice is normally cooked with pandan leaves that gives it a distinctive flavour.

*Nasi lemak* is served with a hot spicy sauce (*sambal*), and usually includes various garnishes, including fresh cucumber slices, small fried anchovies roasted peanuts, and hard-boiled or fried egg. As a more substantial meal, nasi lemak may also be served with an additional protein dish such as fried chicken, cuttlefish in chili, small fried fish, cockles, or chicken *rendang*. Most of these accompaniments are spicy in nature.

Most commonly, this unique dish comes wrapped using a banana leaf into a pyramid-like shape, or in some shops or restaurants is served on a plate. A plate of this rather sinful dish costs less than RM5, but with add-ons like cuttlefish in chili or chicken *rendang*, it can go up to RM12.
