Vowel	<input type="radio"/>	<input type="radio"/> the way in which a syllable in a word is given more force.
Word Family	<input type="radio"/>	<input type="radio"/> a group of words that have the same basic form.
Weak form	<input type="radio"/>	<input type="radio"/> a unit of sound within a word.
Suffix	<input type="radio"/>	<input type="radio"/> is an affix place before the stem of a word.
Prefix	<input type="radio"/>	<input type="radio"/> a sound that involves two vowels joined together.

Diphthong	<input type="radio"/>	<input type="radio"/> when a word changes its pronunciation according to whether it is stressed or not. (It is the unstressed version)
