

In the following summary of Act I in *The Tragedy of Julius Caesar*, all the events are mixed. Think carefully and put these events into the correct order from 1 to 20.

- Casca tells Brutus and Cassius about Antony offering Caesar the crown, the crowd happily shouting, and Caesar having a seizure and coming back to his senses.
- After the games have finished, Caesar returns with an angry look and confides Antony that he's suspicious of Cassius, who's dangerous.
- As they hear the crowd shouting, Brutus and Cassius fear that Caesar will be crowned and Brutus then demands that Cassius (should) come to the point.
- Cassius tells Brutus that he will help the latter to understand himself.
- A soothsayer warns Caesar that the 15th of March will be a dangerous day for him (Caesar is warned to beware the Ides of March).
- After Brutus and Casca have left, Cassius plans to put fake letters where Brutus can find them.
- Casca and Cicero meet and Casca describes the supernatural wonders that he sees in the tempest (but Cicero cannot see them).
- Flavius and Marullus dislike people going around during a working day, and they think there's nothing to celebrate about.
- During the Lupercalia, Caesar asks Mark Antony to touch Calphurnia in order to cure her from her infertility.
- Cassius says that Caesar is a mortal but behaves as if he were a god, so Cassius mocks Caesar and finally tries to persuade Brutus to take action by reminding the latter of his ancestry.
- Caesar dismisses the warning and leaves.
- The people are taking a holiday to celebrate the triumphant return of Julius Caesar.
- Cassius enters the scene (bare-chested) welcoming the tempest and talks to Casca convinced that they must do something.
- Brutus will think about their conversation and points out that the old Brutus would rather be a villager than a Roman citizen under a tyrannical king.
- After telling about the crown event, Casca adds that Flavius and Marullus have been killed for taking Caesar's images away.
- The Feast of the Lupercalia takes place.
- Casca agrees with Cassius and adds that some senators are planning to crown Caesar, who will be king everywhere except Italy.
- Flavius and Marullus decide to remove Caesar's images.
- After Caesar leaves, Cassius stays with Brutus and accuses Brutus of being unfriendly, but Brutus explains that he is troubled by private problems.
- Cassius orders Cinna to put letters in places where Brutus might find them, and they all leave. (End of Act I)
