- D. These pollutants cause health problems for humans, animals and plants.
- E. We need to consider the causes of this dangerous problem if we want to find solutions and reduce its effects on the Australian environment.
- F. Air pollution happens when the air contains harmful pollutants such as gases, smoke or dust.

Explanation: Sentence 1 is a general sentence introducing the topic. Sentence 2 is a definition of air pollution. Sentence 3 tells who has the problem. Sentence 4 gives specific numbers to show how serious the problem is. Sentence 5 widens the effect to other members of the environment. Sentence 6 tells the reader what is coming in the rest of the text. It is the thesis or the main idea of the whole text.
