The purpose of a persuasive essay is to persuade readers to adopt the writer's point of view on an issue and/or agree with a suggested course of action. To accomplish this, you need to develop logical and reasonable arguments that support your opinions.

Main idea (*Topic sentence*)

States the idea you want to support.

Supporting (*Detail 1*)

This paragraph includes the first reason that your claims is valid. Support it with evidence, such as facts, examples and data.

Supporting (*Detail 2*)

This paragraph includes the second reason that you claim is valid. Support it with evidence, such as facts, examples and data.

Supporting (*Detail 3*)

The paragraph should introduce an opposing claim, which is the counter-argument or concession. It also contains the turn-back, which takes the reader back to your claim and position.

Conclusion

End your paragraph with a strong idea related to the topic sentence. Never include new ideas in the concluding sentence.

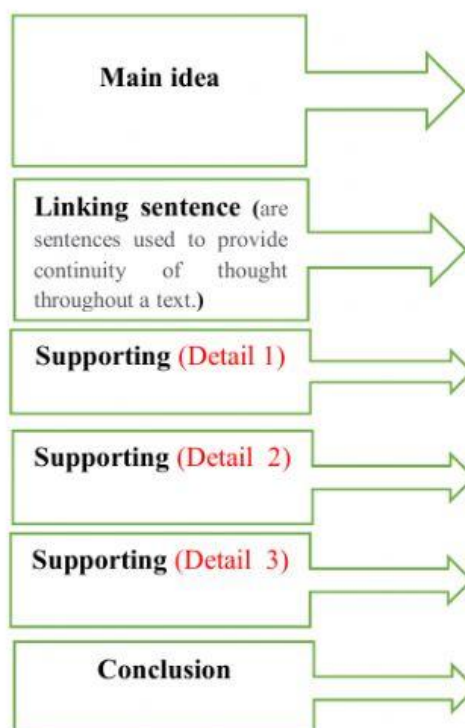
