Reported Speech

El reported speech, o estilo indirecto, sirve para contar lo que ha dicho alguien sin emplear las palabras exactas pronunciadas por esa persona.

Direct Speech: Tanya: I'm doing my homework.'

Reported Speech: Tanya said (that) she was doing her homework.

In this worksheet, we will work only with two verb tense changes:

Direct Speech (normal speech)	Reported Speech
Present Simple → Carolina has lunch at 2 pm.	Past Simple Carolina said she had lunch at 2 pm
Present Continuous → I am studying for a test now.	Past Continuous I said (that) I was studying for a test then.

Pronoun changes

We usually need to change pronouns (I, we) and the verb form when we report speech.

Molly says, 'I enjoy maths.' → Molly says **she** enjoyed maths.

Jason thinks: 'Amy doesn't like **me**.' → Jason thought Amy didn't like **him**.

Say or tell?

We use tell (someone something) if we want to include the person or indirect object.

Anna **told Sue** she was going to the dentist. (the person we communicate is included)

She **tells me** she's happy. (the person we communicate is included)

She **says** she's happy. (the person we communicate isn't included)

Time and place references

In reported speech, we also have to change words like **here**, **now** and **this**.

here – there	today – that day
now – at the time	tonight – that night
this – that	tomorrow – the next/following day
these – those	next week – the next/following week
yesterday – the previous day, the day before	last week – the week before, the previous week

'We live **here**.' → They said they **lived there**.

'I love **this** film.' → He said he **loved that** film.
