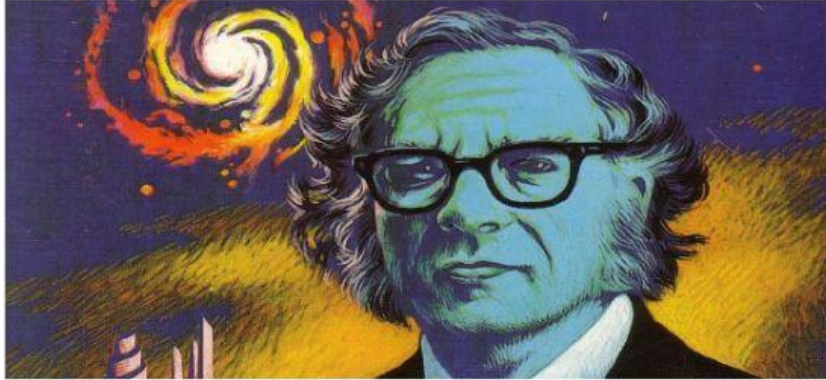


He loved Science Fiction

The author of more than 400 books on a broad range of subjects, Isaac Asimov was a writer and biochemist. He is considered one of the best science fiction authors of the 20th century.

As his writing increased, he moved back to New York City for a freelance career. Over the course of his immensely prolific career as a writer, he won several awards. He died in New York on April 6, 1992 at the age of 72.

In 1938, while he was still a teenager, he sold his first short story "Marooned Off Vesta", published in Amazing Stories. After post-graduate work at Columbia University, Asimov began teaching biochemistry at Boston University in 1949. The next year, in 1950, his first books - the futuristic "Pebble in the Sky" and the thriller "I, Robot" - were published.

Asimov was born in Petrovichi, Russia, Soviet Union on January 2, 1920. His family immigrated to the United States when he was 3. When he was about 9, he began reading science fiction magazines from his parents' candy shop, where all the family worked, in Brooklyn, New York.
