FUTURE CONTINUOUS (will be+V-ing)

I can't go to the cinema tonight. I **will be revising** for my exams

Translate:

AFFIRMATIVE: Professor Asheranother lecture at the same time next week.

NEGATIVE: They class next Monday. They'll be on holiday. (do)

QUESTION: youin this evening? (read)

1. It is used to say that something will be **going on at a certain** time in the future.
2. It's also used for **planned or expected future events**.
3. It can also be used as a **polite way to ask people** what they have already decided to do.

FUTURE PERFECT (will have + V3)
