



VERB TO BE – PRESENT TENSE

The verb "to be" is the most important verb to learn in English. In the present tense it has three forms: am, is, are. In the past tense, it has two forms: was and were.

	You	are not	You're not or you aren't	Second Person
	He	is not	He's not or he isn't	Third Person
	She	is not	She's not or she isn't	Third Person
	It	is not	It's not or it isn't	Third Person
PLURAL	We	are not	We're not or we aren't	First Person
	You	are not	You're not or you aren't	Second Person
	They	are not	They're not or they aren't	Third Person
