



Past Perfect Tense & Past Perfect Continuous Tense



Past Perfect Tense

= An action occurred before another action in the past.

We form the Past Perfect with **had** and the **past participle**

Had + Past Participle

E.g.

I met them after they had divorced each other.

I couldn't take my flight because I had forgotten my boarding pass.

Past Perfect Continuous Tense

= An action started in the past and continued up until another time in the past.

We form the Past Perfect Continuous with **had been** and the **-ing form** of the verb

Had been + -ing form

E.g.

Sara had been working here for 3 weeks when she had the accident.

Richard needed a holiday because he had been working hard for six months.
