Every child in England (46. provide) with full time education from the age of 5 to 16. Many parents send their children to state schools where the tuition and the equipment, textbooks and exercise books (47. give) free of charge. About 5% of children go to fee-paying school. Under the old system, children attended primary school (from 5 to 11) which (48. follow) by a secondary school course (from 11 to 15 or over). At 11 every child had to sit for the eleven-plus examination. It consisted of tests in English, Arithmetic and intelligence tests. Those with the highest marks (about 20% of the children) (49. allow) to go to the grammar school. The others (50. send) to technical schools.
