**Singular and Plurals**

**Plural Rule 1**

● Most words add 's' to make the plural.

- |                        |                            |
|------------------------|----------------------------|
| ● one apple            | two apples <u></u>         |
| ● desk → desks <u></u> | month → months <u></u>     |
| ● book → books <u></u> | train → trains <u></u>     |
| ● pen → pens <u></u>   | name → names <u></u>       |
| ● shop → shops <u></u> | friend → friends <u></u>   |
| chair → chairs <u></u> | teacher → teachers <u></u> |

**Plural Rule 2**

● Add 'es' to words ending in 'ch', 'sh', 's', 'ss', 'x' or 'z' to make the plural.

- |                           |                           |
|---------------------------|---------------------------|
| ● one box                 | many boxes <u></u>        |
| ● wish → wishes <u></u>   | beach → beaches <u></u>   |
| ● cross → crosses <u></u> | waltz → waltzes <u></u>   |
| ● bus → buses <u></u>     | church → churches <u></u> |
| ● dish → dishes <u></u>   | loss → losses <u></u>     |
| fox → foxes <u></u>       | bunch → bunches <u></u>   |

### Plural Rule 3

- When the letter before a 'y' is a consonant, change the 'y' to an 'i' before adding an 'es'.

- |                          |                          |
|--------------------------|--------------------------|
| ● one baby               | two <u>babies</u>        |
| ● city → <u>cities</u>   | berry → <u>berries</u>   |
| ● pony → <u>ponies</u>   | family → <u>families</u> |
| ● reply → <u>replies</u> | lady → <u>ladies</u>     |

The 21 consonant letters in the English alphabet are B, C, D, F, G, H, J, K, L, M, N, P, Q, R, S, T, V, W, X, Z, and usually Y.

### Plural Rule 4

If it ends in a vowel (a, e, i, o, u) and y, just add s

- When words end in 'ay', 'ey', 'iy', 'oy', and 'uy' add an 's' to make the plural.
- |                       |                       |
|-----------------------|-----------------------|
| ● one donkey          | two <u>donkeys</u>    |
| ● day → <u>days</u>   | boy → <u>boys</u>     |
| ● key → <u>keys</u>   | delay → <u>delays</u> |
| ● play → <u>plays</u> | guy → <u>guys</u>     |

### Plural Rule 5

- When words end in 'f' or 'fe' change the 'f' or 'fe' to a 'v' before adding 'es'.
- |                        |                      |
|------------------------|----------------------|
| ● one knife            | two <u>knives</u>    |
| ● leaf → <u>leaves</u> | life → <u>lives</u>  |
| ● half → <u>halves</u> | hoof → <u>hooves</u> |

● wife → wives

thief → thieves

**Exceptions → cliffs, chiefs, roofs, dwarfs and handkerchiefs.**

### **Plural Rule 6**

● **When a word ends in an 'o' and comes after a consonant, add 'es' to make the plural.**

● one tomato

two tomatoes

● cargo → cargoes

mango → mangoes

● echo → echoes

hero → heroes

volcano → volcanoes

torpedo → torpedoes

**Exceptions → pianos, banjos, solos, radios and Eskimos.**

### **Plural Rule 7**

● **Sometimes a word may completely change its form when a plural is made.**

● one child

two children

● person → people

goose → geese

● man → men

woman → women

● cactus → cacti

fungus → fungi

### **Plural Rule 8**

● **Sometimes a word may stay the same in both its singular and plural form.**

● one fish

many fish

● tuna → tuna

trout → trout

● **deer** → **deer**

**moose** **moose**

**sheep** → **sheep**

**series** → **series**
