

Describing people with *who*

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I have a friend.	<u>She</u> collects coins.
I have a friend who collects coins.	
Nico has <u>two sisters</u> .	<u>They</u> play soccer.
Nico has two sisters who play soccer.	
The <u>boy</u> is friendly.	<u>He</u> sits next to me.
The boy who sits next to me is friendly.	
The <u>people</u> are French.	<u>They</u> live next door.
The people who live next door are French.
