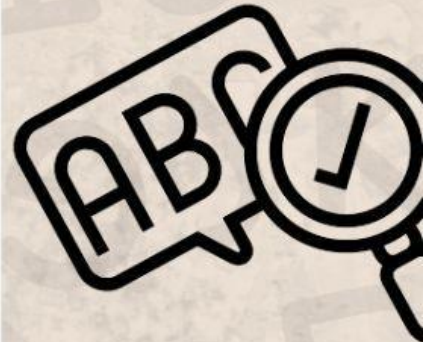


Simple VS Compound Sentence
