

# PRESENT SIMPLE (Interrogative form)

We use Do or Does to make questions.  
Do I/You/We/They eat bread?  
Does He/She/It eat bread?

The verb doesn't change in 3rd person singular.

Does she eats bread?  
Does she eat bread? ✓

Answers  
Yes, I do.  
No, I don't.  
Yes, she does.  
No, she doesn't.
