Fashion



FASHION

In historical terms, the idea of fashion design is quite new. Charles Worth, who was from England, is thought to have been the first fashion designer. He set up his fashion house in Paris in 1858. Before Worth, people usually asked dressmakers to create what they, the client, wanted. Charles Worth did the opposite – he told his customers what to wear! He set trends and established the job of a fashion designer. Design houses like his started to employ artists to sketch pictures of clothes to show their clients, instead of making complete garments. The clients made choices and orders from the drawings. The fashion houses started to earn a lot of money. Today fashion houses and top designers control what we all wear, from hats to shoes and everything in between. There are three types of clothes that designers and manufacturers produce today.

Haute couture

This is the most expensive and exclusive clothing to buy. A garment is made specifically to fit one person only. The fabric that is used is very good quality and the garment is almost completely created and sewn by hand. Because of the cost of creating the clothes, haute couture doesn't make a big profit, but it is excellent for the reputation of the designer and fashion house.

Ready-to-wear

Ready-to-wear clothes are not as expensive as haute couture. They are produced using good quality fabrics and they are well-designed and made. However, these clothes are not created for individual people but for the general public. They are sold in standard sizes, in

shops. Usually, there is only a limited number of clothes of the same design, so this means that not everyone is wearing the same dress or jacket. The designers' collections of ready-to-wear are shown during fashion weeks in cities around the world twice a year.

Mass market

Most people buy this type of clothing. After top fashion designers show their collections in fashion weeks, the high street clothing companies wait to see which trends, styles and colours become popular. Then they make their own versions using cheaper materials and methods of production. These clothes don't always last long and people throw them away regularly and replace them.
