*That* → se usa para nombres en singular (ese/esa o aquel/aquella)

*Those* → es la forma plural de *that* (esos/esas o aquellos/aquellas)

Plural forms
Regular plural: adding -s at the end. <i>Cat</i> → <i>cats</i>
If the word ends in s, ss, sh, ch, x, z, o, we add -es. <i>Bus</i> → <i>buses</i> , <i>marsh</i> → <i>marshes</i> ...
If the word ends in -y, it becomes -ies. <i>City</i> → <i>cities</i> , <i>puppy</i> → <i>puppies</i> ...
If the word ends in -fe, it becomes -ives. <i>Wife</i> → <i>wives</i> , <i>wolf</i> → <i>wolves</i> ...
