## REGULAR VERBS

## IRREGULAR VERBS

- Regular verbs form their past and past participle forms by adding **-ed**.

- Irregular verbs form their past and past participle forms in different ways.

There are mainly rules of regular verbs

There are mainly three types of irregular verbs:

### Rule #1

### Type # 1

If a verb ends in **-e**, add **-d**.

Verbs in which all the three forms are the same (e.g. put – put – put)

- like → liked
- arrive → arrived
- decide → decided

### Type # 2

### Rule #2

Verbs in which two of the three forms are the same (e.g. sit – sat – sat)

If a verb ends in consonant + **-y**, change **-y** to **-i** and add **-ed**.

- carry → carried
- try → tried
- study → studied

### Type # 3

### Rule #3

Verbs in which all three forms are different (e.g. drink – drank – drunk)

If a verb ends in vowel + **-y**, add **-ed**.\*

- play → played
- stay → stayed
- enjoy → enjoyed

#### Rule #4

If a verb ends in a consonant-vowel-consonant (CVC) pattern, double the final consonant and add *-ed*.\*\*

- hug → hugged
- plan → planned
- stop → stopped

#### Rule #5

For all other verbs, add *-ed*.

- watch → watched
- ask → asked
- clean → cleaned

Some verbs can be both regular and irregular.

Burn – burnt – burnt (irregular)

Burn – burned – burned (regular)

Dream – dreamt – dreamt (irregular)

Dream – dreamed – dreamed (regular)

Lean – lent – lent (irregular)

Lean – leaned – leaned (regular)

Learn – learnt – learnt (irregular)

Learn – learned – learned (regular)

Leap – leapt – leapt (irregular)

Leap – leaped – leaped (regular)

Smell – smelt – smelt (irregular)

Smell – smelled – smelled (regular)

Spill – spilt – spilt (irregular)

Spill – spilled – spilled (regular)

Spoil – spoilt – spoilt (irregular)

Spoil – spoiled – spoiled (regular)
