

## A Festival of Colors

The Festival of Holi, or The Festival of Colors, is an ancient Hindu celebration that occurs at the beginning of spring. People all over India celebrate Holi by throwing paints on each other. They make the paints, called gulal, from spring flowers. Some people put them in tubes called pichkaris. Others throw the paint with their hands. As part of the festival, people hang a

container of milk in the street. Boys form human pyramids to try to break the container. Girls throw paint at them. After the festival, everyone, young and old, is pink and blue and red and yellow — the colors are very bright, and everyone has a lot of fun. There are also games, songs and special candy. For many people, Holi is a time to have fun and forget about rules and responsibilities.
