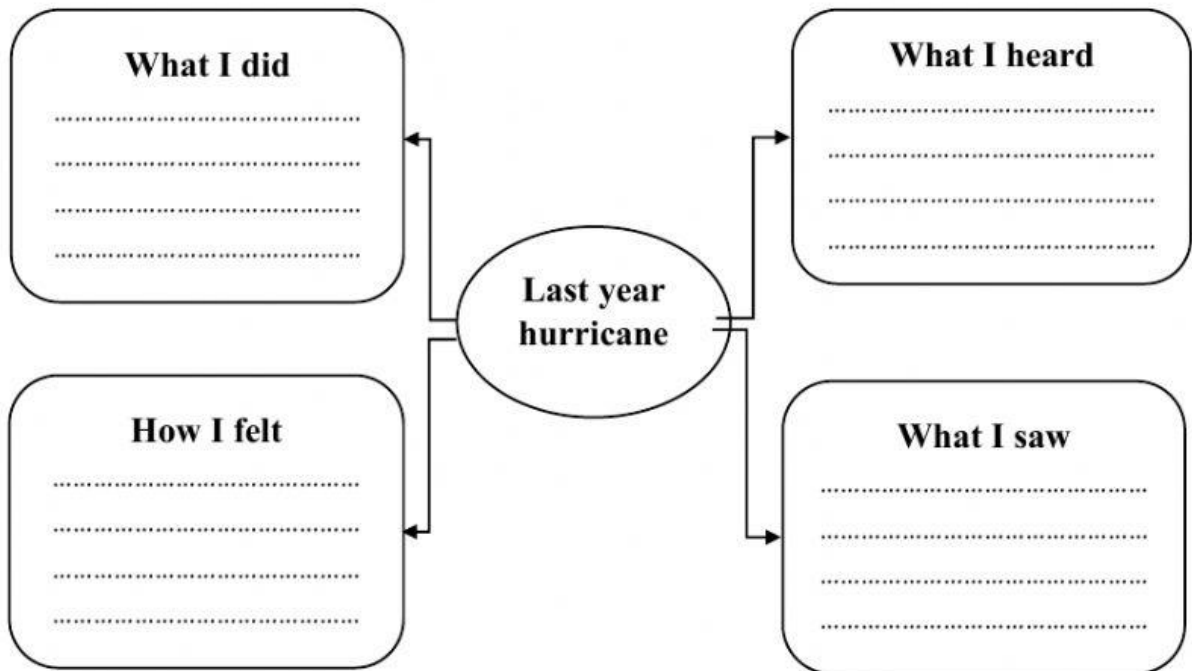
I. Read. Complete the diagram with words from the text.
