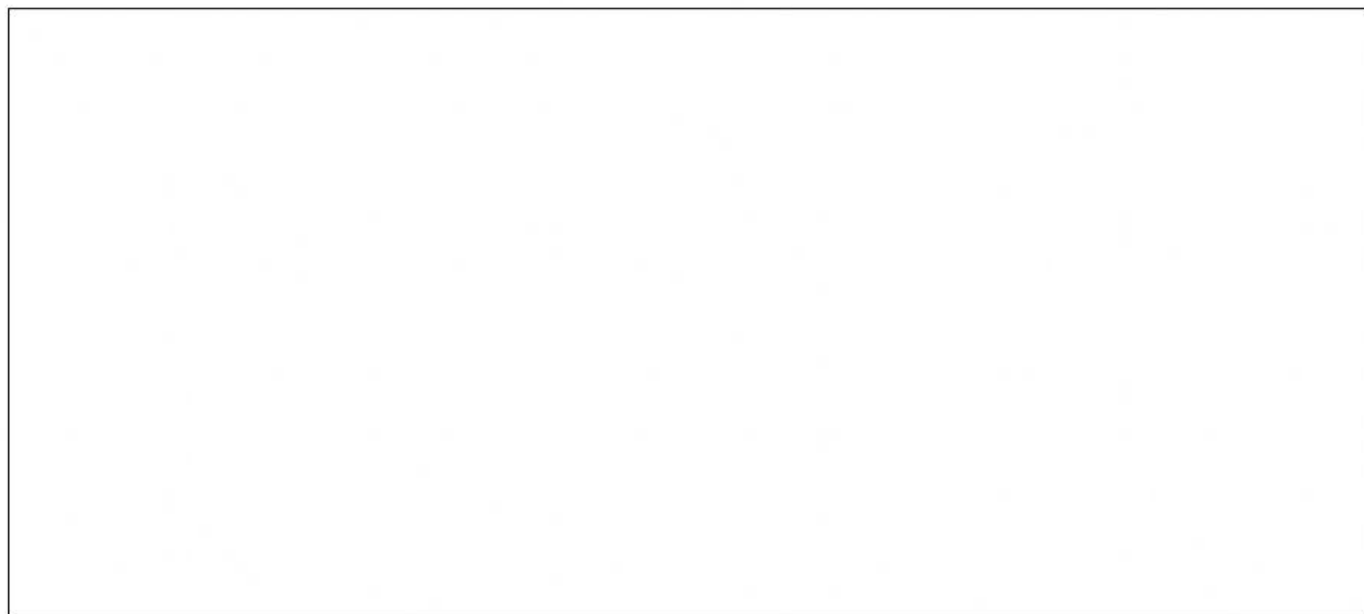


Extreme Terror Rides
