



Auxiliary verbs are verbs which we use with main verbs in different tenses in English. We use *do* in the present simple for negatives, questions and short answers.

*My sister **doesn't like** reading on a tablet.*

***Do** you like taking photos? Yes, I **do**.*

We use *did* in the past simple for negatives, questions and short answers.

*We **didn't phone** you last night.*

***Did** you go to the park? No, I **didn't**.*

We use *be* in the present continuous for all forms.

*James **is using** my tablet at the moment.*

*They **aren't buying** a new laptop.*
