- PRESENT SIMPLE - **Positive Sentences**: we use the present simple mainly to talk about:



EXAMPLES:

I go to school at 6:45.



We have lunch at 12:30 pm.



They play basketball in the afternoon.



You never do your homework on holiday.



- In **positive sentences** with **HE – SHE – IT**, the verb **changes!**
- We need to add:

OMG!



-S

-ES

-IES

Important

He goes to bed early on weekdays.



Mary studies French online on Mondays and Wednesdays.



The cat always plays with a ball of yarn.



My dad is a doctor.
He works in a hospital.



- PRESENT SIMPLE – **Negative Sentences:**

To make a **negative sentence** in the present simple, we use two auxiliaries...

I
YOU
WE
THEY

DON'T




DOESN'T

HE
SHE
IT

EXAMPLES:

I don't go to school at 7:15 am.



We don't have lunch at 1:00 pm.



He doesn't go to bed late on weekdays.



Mary doesn't study German online.

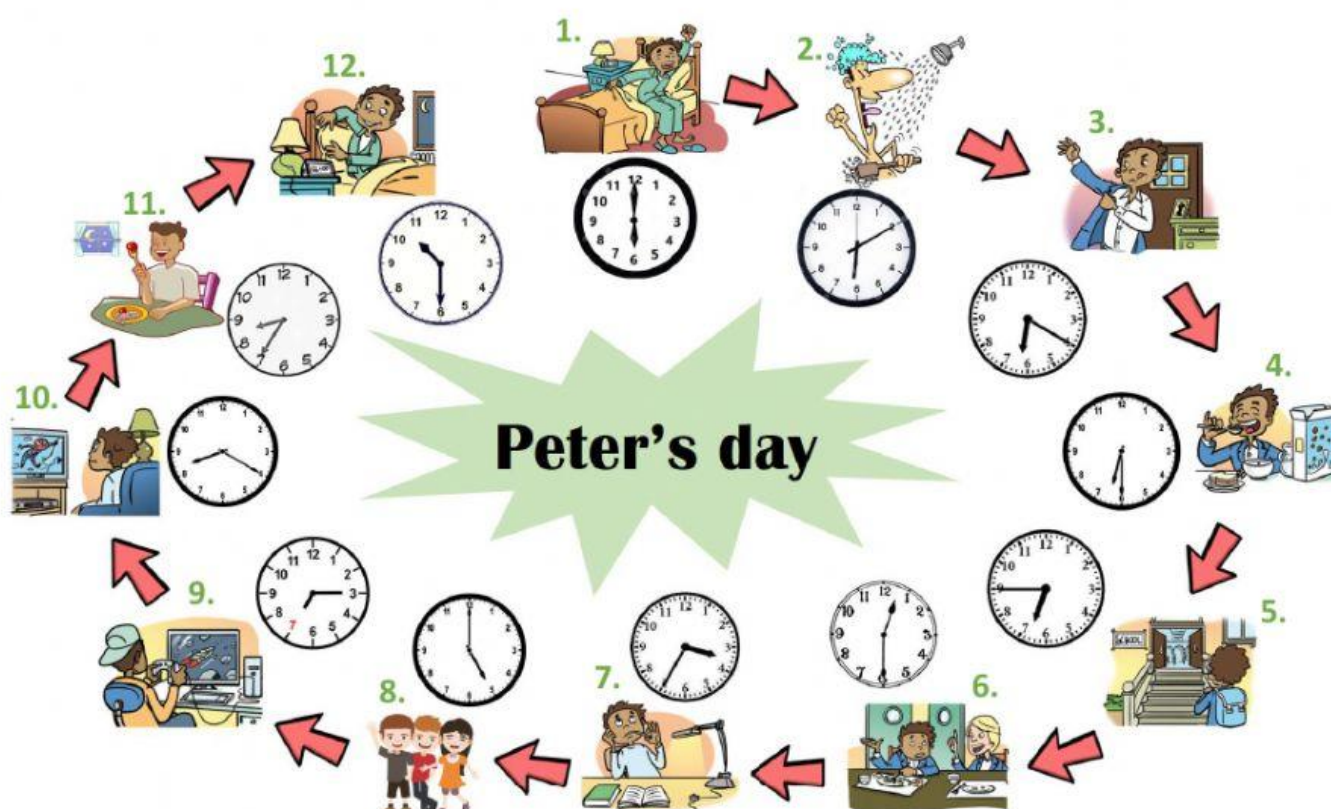
PRESENT SIMPLE: Positive and Negative Sentences
