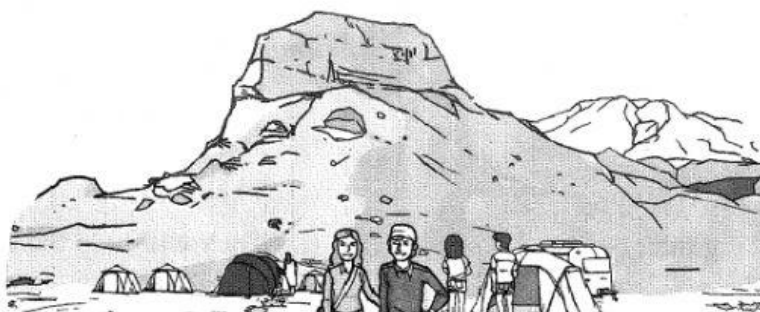

Advertising promotes the recognition of a brand, persuades consumers to try it, and attempts to keep them devoted to it. Perhaps the most crucial purpose of consumer advertising is brand loyalty. Manufacturers want their customers to buy from them again and again, whether they make vehicles, canned goods, or cosmetics. The quality of the product will encourage **this**, of course, but so, too, will have certain effect on advertising.

Market research techniques are used in advertising to discover **potential** customers of a product. Are they homemakers or professional people? Are they young or old? Are they city dwellers or country dwellers? Such questions have a bearing on where and when ads should be played. By studying readership breakdowns for newspapers and magazines as well as television ratings and other statistics, an advertising agency can decide on the best way of reaching potential buyers. Detailed research and marketing expertise are essential today when advertising budgets can run into thousands of millions of dollars. Advertising is a fast-paced, high-pressure industry. There is a constant need for creative ideas that will establish a personality for a product in the public's mind. Current developments in advertising increase the need for talented workers.

The classic white family — breadwinner father, nonworking mother, and two children — was the target of most advertising in the past. According to new research, just roughly 6% of American homes fulfill this stereotype. Instead, society is divided into many groups, with working mothers, single people and older people on the rise. To be most successful, advertising must identify a particular section and aim its message toward that group.

Advertising is also making use of new technologies. Computer graphics are used to grab the attention of consumers and to help them see products **in a new light**. The use of computer graphics in a commercial for canned goods, for instance, gave a new image to the tin can.
