dress down: to reprimand severely, to dress more casually than usual – khiển trách; ăn mặc thoải mái

fall out with: to have an argument with – cãi nhau với ai

give off: to emit, to release (a smell or light) – thải ra, tỏa ra mùi hương

hit on: to discover or realize something, to discuss, to flirt with sb – phát hiện, nhận ra; thảo luận; tán tỉnh ai

kick in: to contribute money, to begin taking effect – đóng góp tiền; bắt đầu có hiệu lực

lay down: to keep or save something for the future, to establish (laws, rules) – để dành; thiết lập (luật)

make for: to move in the direction of, to cause (something) to happen – di chuyển về hướng; gây ra
