POSSESSIVE CASE (GENERAL RULE)

- Singular possessor + 's + thing
Lucy's bike
James's car (but also: James' car)
The baker's (shop) / John's (house)
- Possessors + ' + thing
The students' school
The Simpsons' house
but: Our children's books
- Two possessors + 's + thing
Jack and Jim's house
- Possessor's and possessor's + things
Jim's and Mark's bikes

WITH

people
animals
places, countries and cities
time and measure expressions
indefinite pronouns
means of transport

OF + NOUN

with non-living objects
The pages of the book

in relative clauses
The father of the girl who lives...

In case of double possessive
The dog of Mark's brother

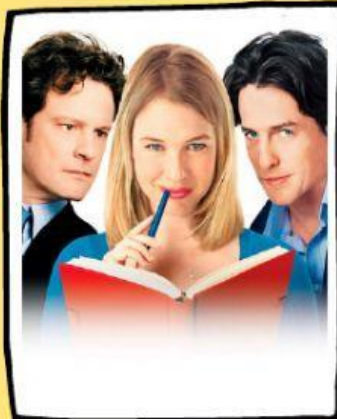
