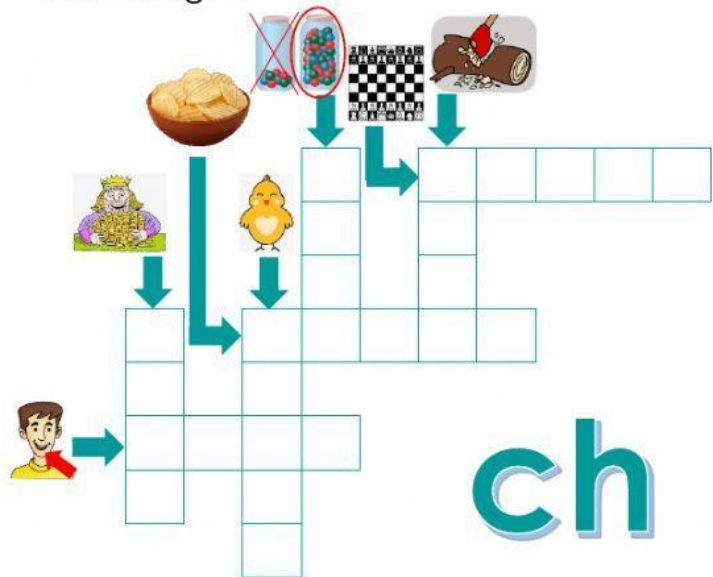


# Consonant Digraph ch
