SOURCE 1

The Africans



The Africans were brought by the Atlantic Slave Trade. Europeans enslaved Africans and took them to labour in the Americas. The slave trade was conducted by merchant companies. They would carry goods such as cloth, knives, tools, cutlasses, brandy, gunpowder and iron bars as well as cheap manufactured goods.

The articles were used to purchase slaves in Africa. Sometimes the traders themselves raided villages to get slaves. Once the ships were loaded with slaves they set out across the Atlantic on the dreaded Middle Passage. The conditions were so bad that many slaves died from disease before they reached the Americas. Those who survived and reached Jamaica were sold.

Source 2

The English



Jamaica became a colony of another European country – England; and English settlers replaced the Spaniards.

Many of these English settlers were small farmers who were anxious to own or lease some of the fertile lands in Jamaica. A large number of settlers were indentured servants who signed a contract to work for planters for five to ten years in return for their passage. They were paid no wages and were little better than slaves.

Religious intolerance in England also caused many people to leave that country and settle overseas where they could worship freely in their own way.

Some people in England felt that the country was becoming overpopulated and that this excess population could best be put to use in the tropical colonies. They believed that in these countries people could grow tropical crops like sugar cane, which England needed, but could not grow itself.

Source 3



The East Indians First arrived in 1834 and settled in Jamaica, Trinidad and Tobago, Barbados and Guyana. They were not slaves. Many Indians remained in the region when their contract of five to ten years ended. The Indians came to the Caribbean for many reasons. Some of which were:

- The decline of the agriculture sector in India
- Extended drought
- Poor harvest
- Famine
- Heavy taxation and low wages

Their settlement led to the introduction of their culture which is integrated in the way of life of Jamaicans.

The Chinese were brought to the Caribbean under the indentureship system, like the East Indians. They did not enjoy working on the sugar plantations. This led to many of them returning home after their contract ended. Those who remained in the region began operating small businesses such as grocery shops and barberdasherries.

In Jamaica, the Chinese skills and talent of Chinese migrants have been used in construction of durable Jamaican roads (Highway 2000 and North South Highway).
