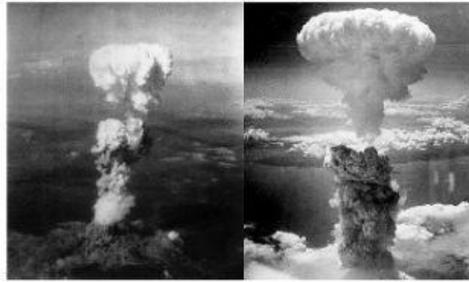


1. Read this article about values and inventions.
