Westlake College in Virginia will start a laptop computer program that allows students to do schoolwork anywhere they want. Within five years, each of 1500 students at the college will receive a laptop. The laptop is a part of \$10 million computer program at Westlake, 100-year-old college. The students with a laptop will also have access to the Internet. In addition, they will be able to use e-mail to *peak* with their teacher, their classmates and their family. However, the most important part of the laptop program is that students will be able to use the computer without going to computer labs. They can work with it at home, in the fast food restaurant or under the trees-anywhere at all! Because of the many changes in computer technology, laptop use in higher education, such as colleges and universities, is workable. As laptops become powerful, they become more similar to desktop computers. In addition, the portable computers can connect students to not only the Internet, but also libraries and other resources.
