## QUANTIFIERS: SOME/ANY

STATEMENT	NEGATIVE	QUESTION
<b>Plural Nouns</b> I have <u>some</u> cookies.	I don't have <u>any</u> cookies.	Do you have <u>any</u> cookies?
<b>Uncountable Nouns</b> I need <u>some</u> water.	I don't need <u>any</u> water.	Do you need <u>any</u> water?

**NOTE 1:** With questions in which we expect the answer to be 'Yes', we can use 'some' instead of 'any'. Example: "Could you please give me some bananas?"

**NOTE 2:** Some common uncountable nouns include: *coffee, food, help, homework, information, milk, money, paper, rice, salt, soup, sugar, tea, time, water*.
