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

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

Andy Goldsworthy has been working with natural materials to make unique sculptures since his days as an art student. He's a sculptor who is interested in 'movement, light, growth and decay'. He usually works outside and with his bare hands to create structures out of stone, snow, ice, sand, wood or brightly-coloured leaves. A striking example of his work is an ice arch – which he succeeded in building one early winter morning in Canada – as the sun became warmer the arch gradually melted and finally collapsed.

Tracey Emin's first piece of public art is *Roman Standard* in the centre of Liverpool. It's a bronze sculpture of a bird on top of a four-metre high pole. In an interview, Emin said: 'Since 1992 I've been making a series of drawings and prints of birds. I've always had the idea that birds are the angels of this earth and that they represent freedom.' Reactions to the sculpture are not all positive: 'I don't think it's art – it's a complete waste of money!' The bird is certainly small – in fact it disappears if you stand directly in front of it and only reappears if you move to the left or right.





Since the late 1980s, Rachel Whiteread has been creating unusual sculptures of everyday domestic items – the empty spaces under chairs and staircases, around baths, and inside cupboards and rooms. One of the most famous of these was her first public sculpture, the award-winning *House* – a concrete cast of the inside of a terraced house in east London. She recently created a huge sculpture consisting of 14,000 white plastic boxes cast from ten different cardboard boxes. Whiteread also uses materials like plaster, rubber and polystyrene to define the space around or inside objects and buildings.

For many years, prize-winning artist Chris Ofili has been using elephant dung in his paintings as a symbol of his African heritage. He also stands his paintings on elephant dung, which he gets free of charge from London Zoo. One of his best-known works is *No Woman No Cry*, the title of a Bob Marley song. The painting is a tribute to the family of Stephen Lawrence, a London teenager who was murdered by a racist gang. The boy's face can be seen in each of the crying woman's tears.
