

All About The Piano

The piano is one of the most popular musical instruments. It can be played solo or in a band and some of the most famous songs were written for piano. You can also play different styles of music on it – anything from classical to rock.

The first piano was built in 1694, in Italy, by a man who fixed damaged musical instruments. There are still three pianos that exist today from that time period. To play the piano, the player must use both hands and sometimes both feet. A pianist controls how soft or loud the music is by playing more lightly or heavily. This makes it different from most other instruments, where the volume cannot be easily changed. This is because the piano combines different types of instruments.

When you press a piano key, a hammer hits a string inside the piano. This is what makes the sound you hear. If you open a piano up, you may be surprised to see dozens of metal strings. The greatest thing about the piano is that it is very easy to get started. Anyone, even a young child, can learn a simple tune. Other instruments like the trumpet and the violin need more practice just to play one note. However, it takes years and years of work plus an excellent teacher to become a great pianist.

Most kids start playing the piano because it gives them a good introduction to music. And learning music can help kids become better students, as they have to think about many things at the same time.
