In 1858, a French engineer, Thome De Garmond arrived in England with a plan for a 21-mile tunnel across the English Channel. He said that it would be possible to build a platform in the centre of the Channel. This platform would **serve** as a port and a railway station. This tunnel would be well ventilated if tall chimneys were built above the sea level.

In 1860, a better plan was put forward by an Englishman, William Low. He suggested that a double railway tunnel should be built. **This** would solve the problem of ventilation. For if a train entered this tunnel, it would draw in fresh air behind it. Forty- two years later, a tunnel was actually begun. If, at the time, the British had not feared invasion, it would have been completed. Recently, there has again been great interest in the idea of a Channel Tunnel. If it is built, it will connect Britain to Europe for the first time in history.
