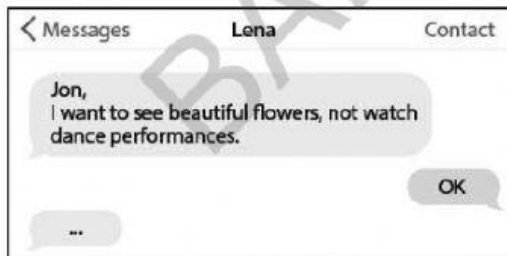

 The bus **leaves** in ten minutes.
