

We use the **Present Simple** to talk about things we know will definitely happen in the future, such as timetables or programs for shops, movie theaters, restaurants, or public transport, etc.

The festival **starts** at 6 p.m.

The festival **ends** at 10 p.m.

The food stands **open** at 5:30 p.m.

They **close** at 10:30 p.m.

The bus **leaves** in ten minutes.

What time does the music performance **start**?

Does the **festival** **start** in the morning?

(Yes, it **does**./No, it **doesn't**.)


