UNICEF means the United Nations Children's Fund. It serves children in (31) _____ all over the world. It helps children of all races, nationalities, religions, and political systems in more than 140 (32) _____ countries. The purpose of UNICEF is to help provide better life for children and their mothers. UNICEF gives both long-term assistance and (33) _____ help.

UNICEF was created in 1946 to help bring food and medicine to children who (34) _____ during World War II in Europe.
