

Commas in a Series of Nouns

A **comma** tells a reader where to pause. A comma also helps to make the meaning of a sentence clear.

Thinking Question

Are there three or more words listed together in the sentence?

When you list three or more words together in a sentence, the list is called a **series**. Use commas to separate nouns in a series.

Ellie likes carrots, potatoes, and green beans.
Anne, Marie, and TJ do not like beets.
