

NEW YEAR CELEBRATIONS AROUND THE WORLD

How did you celebrate the start of the new year 2019? Maybe you went to a party or watched on TV. Maybe your family has a special food you eat on New Year's Day. People all over the world have different ways of welcoming the start of a new year.



New Year's Day, January 1, is a holiday in many countries. In Australia, since it is summer there at this time of the year, people celebrate on January 1 with outdoor activities like picnics on the beach, rodeos, and surf carnivals.

In Spain, it is a tradition to eat 12 grapes, one each time a clock chimes, at midnight on New Year's Day. Spanish people say eating grapes brings good luck.

Some people in the southern United States eat black eyed peas and turnip greens on January 1 to bring good luck earning money in the new year. The peas represent coins and the greens stand for dollars.

Other countries start the new year on a day other than January 1. Many Chinese people celebrate new year between January 21st and February 20th. Their celebration is based on the lunar calendar, which starts each new month on the day of the new moon. Big parades with huge floats of dancing dragon and lions mark the start of the new year. The dragon is a symbol of wealth and long life. Some Chinese people also set off firecrackers, because they believe loud noises scare away evil spirits.
