Passage 14

The past several centuries have __1__ pronounced increases in the height of populations all around the world. Houses built in New England 300 years ago seem quaint today because of the diminutive size of everything, particularly the __2__ of doorways. In 1920 the average student at Harvard University was one and a quarter inches taller and 10 pounds heavier than the average student had been a generation earlier.

Scientists still have not pinpointed the exact __3__ of this accelerated growth.
