**C**

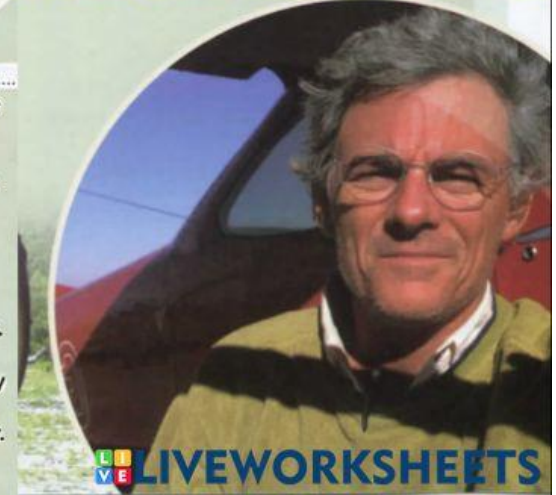
