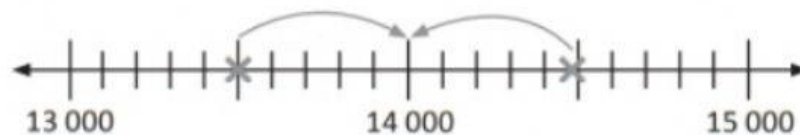

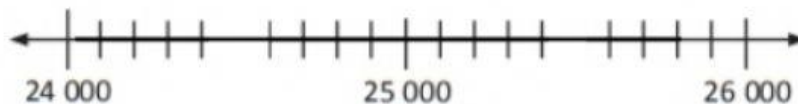
Osman saved about \$14 000.

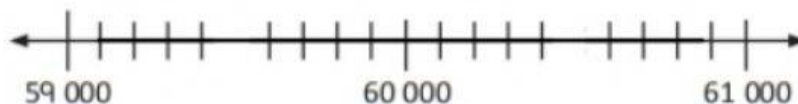
